What is
Pupil Premium?



The Pupil Premium Funding is given to schools for the specific purpose of boosting the attainment of pupils. If you are in receipt of one of the following qualifying benefits, then your child may be eligible:

- Income Support (IS)
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual taxable income (as assessed by The Inland Revenue) which from 6 April 2011 does not exceed £16,190
- Income-Based Job Seekers' Allowance (IB JSA)
- Employment Support Allowance (Income Related) (ASA(IRA))
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Funding is based on children who have registered for a free school meal at any point in the last 6 years, children that are in care or adopted, and children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

How are we spending the funding?

Regular 1-2-1 tuition that improves Reading, Writing and Maths.



Intervention groups run by experienced Teaching Assistants to support children's social and emotional development.



Support in funding enrichment activities such as school trips.



Funding additional Read, Write, Inc teachers to keep group sizes as small as possible.

Free milk daily and a school uniform grant.
